GENERAL INFORMATION

AUTOMOBILE PARKING AND EXHIBITOR PASSES

The Northwest Florida Fair provides parking and passes for exhibitors participating in shows or hosts the 4-H building. The parking is located to the rear of the main building near the Carnival Crews Parking Area. Passes are available for pick-up at exhibit check in or at the UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Office the week prior to fair.

LIABILITY

All property of each character, whether entered for exhibit or any other purpose will be taken into the grounds and buildings and kept entirely at the risk of the owner who assumes all responsibility for loss, damage, or theft. ALL REASONABLE CARE will be taken of exhibits; however the UF/IFAS Extension Okaloosa County Office or the Fair Association are NOT liable for damage, breakage, theft, etc. The Northwest Florida fair and the UF/IFAS Extension Okaloosa County office are not responsible for damage done by animals or injuries to animals.

PRESS RELEASE STATEMENT

Many photographs can and will be taken at fair. By signing the registration for participation in any event, you are authorizing the Florida 4-H Youth Development Program staff permission to take photographs and/or record video and/or audio of any youth involved and/or exhibits and to use these for 4-H Youth Development educational, promotional, and/or marketing materials. Furthermore by signing the registration you also do hereby given the right to exhibit any such works publicly or privately, including posting on the Florida 4-H Youth Development Program website. You also waive any rights, claims, or interests you may have to control the use of your identity, the identity of the subject(s), or likeness in the photographs, video or audio and agree that any uses described herein may be made without compensation or additional consideration.

STATEMENT TO WINNERS

Premiums will be paid from the awards as marked in the judges' books and not from ribbons that may be attached to exhibits. Ribbons sometimes become misplaced.

Premiums will be paid as soon as possible after compiling and checking all data taken at fair, no later than 30 days from the last day of fair. All checks for premium monies awarded in connection with the fair shall be negotiated by the recipient/payee within 90 days from the date of the check. If the recipient/payee fails to timely negotiate said check, all premiums shall be forfeited.

GENERAL RULES

UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Personnel and the Northwest Florida Fair reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard thereto. They further reserves the right to amend or to add to these rules as both parties see fit and to withdraw all premium offerings in all departments should an emergency exist or circumstance demand it.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

CLOVERBUD DIVISION – Must have reached their 5th birthday and not passed their 8th birthday by September 1, 2018. (Receive participation ribbon in all exhibit categories.)

JUNIOR DIVISION - Must have reached their 8th birthday before and had not passed their 11th birthday by September 1, 2018.

INTERMEDIATE – Must be 11 before and have not passed their 14th birthday by September 1, 2018.

SENIOR DIVISION - Must be 14 and have not passed their 18th birthday or graduated from high school by September 1, 2018.

PRE-REGISTRATION

Pre-Registration is required and should be dropped off or mailed to the UF/IFAS Okaloosa County 4-H Office 3098 Airport Rd. Crestview, FL 32539 by 4:30PM on Monday, September 03, 2018. ARTICLES ENTERED MUST FOLLOW GUIDELINES ESTABLISHED. Items must have been made by youth in last year (since September 2017). UNSUITABLE EXHIBITS or exhibits of poor quality may be refused.

EXHIBIT REMOVAL

Removal of 4-H livestock show exhibits **MUST** be approved by the fair event coordinator. Removal of exhibits without approval may cause forfeiture of premium money, and/or other awards.

REMOVAL OF ITEMS FROM FAIR shall be done Saturday, September 29, 2018, after 10:00PM, or Sunday, September 30, 2018, from 10:00AM-2:00PM. There will be no staff at the fairgrounds after 2:00PM. Therefore, you must have everything out or forfeiture of premiums and any exhibits still present may occur. Removal of items before this time can also cause forfeiture of premium money and/or other awards.

CLEANING OF ARENA, BARN, AND BUILDING

All youth participating in any capacity at the Northwest Florida Fair will be required to participate in clean-up at fair completion. If youth have live animal exhibits they must clean their own cages to include: Removing all shaving, cleaning around the surrounding area and bottom board (if present), and cleaning all feed and water containers.

All youth participating in shows will be required to patrol the arena and barn area for garbage after each show. They will also be required to clean stalls that they utilize for their animals to include: removal of all shavings and cleaning of any feed and water troughs utilized.

1. Entries must be registered by the date noted above
2. Northwest Florida Fair will not be responsible for injury, theft, damage, or death of any animals/equipment
3. All decisions of events coordinator, judges and Fair Association are final
4. Exhibitor forfeits award/premium if entry is removed prior to release time
5. No live animal exhibits will be accepted
6. Each 4-H member may enter up to 4 exhibits in each project area with a maximum of 16 total exhibit entries permitted
7. Exhibits must be made in the past 4-H year
8. Exhibitors who do not follow size limitations will be refused
9. Standard Danish System judging applies
10. Special Merit Award-demonstrate especially outstanding efforts and excellent quality (limit of 5 awards are available)

CATEGORIES - 4-H EXHIBITS

- 1. Civic and Leadership Development**
 - a. Includes all exhibits related to citizenship, community service programs, and leadership.
- 2. Workforce Preparation and Career Development**
 - a. Includes all exhibits related to career exploration, preparing for a career, and entrepreneurship.
- 3. Clothing and Textiles**
 - a. Includes all exhibits related to clothing design, selection, buying, care, construction, textiles, accessories, personal appearance, and grooming.
- 4. Sewing/Crocheting/Weaving**
 - a. Includes all exhibits that have been sewn, crocheted, or woven by the youth.
- 5. Consumer Education, Money Management, and Home Management**
 - a. Includes all exhibits related to comparison shopping, sales approaches, advertising, consumer rights and responsibilities, labeling, credit, money management, banking, investment savings, and time management.
- 6. Earth Sciences**
 - a. Includes all exhibits in the areas of energy, earth science, astronomy, water quality/conservation, natural resources conservation and quality, soil science, geology, and weather.
- 7. Food Science and Safety** - Includes exhibits regarding food safety topics and food science, such as vacuum packaging, food irradiation, pesticides, food additives and biotechnology in foods.
 - a. Food Preservation Exhibit
 - b. Must be packaged in standard canning jars
 - c. No rings should be left on jars
 - d. Recipe procedure must be included on 3X5 index card.
 - e. Jar must be labeled with contents
 - f. Pickles, preserves, jams, jellies, fruits, vegetables and meats may be entered
- 8. Natural Resources**
 - a. Includes all exhibits in the areas of forestry, marine and aquatic science, wildlife ecology, entomology, shooting sports, archery and riflery, and sport fishing.
- 9. Health and Safety**
 - a. Includes all exhibits related to general health education (i.e. coping with stress, first aid, substance abuse, self-help skills, physical fitness, dental care, healthy lifestyles, sex education, immunizations, and prevention of disease). Also includes all presentations dealing with accidental safety hazards including demonstrations in disaster preparedness or home environmental health (i.e. mold, radon or other hazards).
- 10. Horse**
 - a. Includes all exhibits pertaining to horses and horsemanship.
- 11. Animal Sciences**
 - a. Animal Industry
 - i. Includes all exhibits related to beef and dairy cattle, swine, layer, broilers, turkeys, rabbits, meat and dairy goats, quail, duck, geese and ratite.

Exhibits can include systems relating to genetic selection, feeding management, health management, reproductive management and marketing. Systems also relating to converting or utilizing live animals to create food products such as milk, eggs, and meat. **No equine related topics will be accepted in the category.**

b. Small Animal and Pets

- i. Includes all presentations related to dogs, cats, rabbits, rodent pets, and other pets, including pet facilitated therapy in nursing homes, etc.

12. Human Development

- a. Includes all exhibits related to human growth, development, lifespan, personality and character development, and other interpersonal relations.

13. Leisure Crafts/Arts/Recreational Hobby

- a. Includes all exhibits of music, art, crafts, wood working and metal.

14. Mechanical, Electronic Science, Petroleum Power, and Small Engines

- a. Includes all exhibits related to general engineering, bicycle maintenance and mechanical operations, automotive, electronics, aerospace/aviation, and computers. Also, all exhibits related to use and conservation of petroleum-based fuels and the selection, care, and operation of small engines.

15. Communication and Media Arts

- a. Includes exhibits on the “topic” of public speaking, American Sign Language and other forms of communication. All phases of photography, graphic arts, computer graphics, video and other current technologies used in communication media.

16. Plant Connections-requires a small explanation of what was learned

- a. Includes all exhibits relating to production and marketing of fruits, vegetables, flowers, turf, ornamental, field crops and forage, landscaping, green houses, propagation soils, hanging baskets, bulbs, citrus and harvesting or processing crops.
- b. Floral Arranging
 - i. Includes any cut flower or plant arrangement made by the exhibitor.
- c. Gardening Project
 - i. Harvested fruits and vegetables.
 - ii. Each entry is to be composed of several items arranged in an attractive display; unusual or large specimens may be entered singly.
- d. Ornamental Project
 - i. Specimens must be owned by member and been in his/her possession for at least three months.
 - ii. Plants and flowers must be labeled with common and botanical name.
 - iii. All plants must be in good condition. Containers should be covered for attractive display.

17. Waste Management

- a. Includes exhibits relating to the management of solid and hazardous waste such as reducing, reusing, recycling, litter control and composting as a recycling/waste management process.

18. Pallet Art

- a. Includes exhibits relating to reuse of standard size or smaller pallets in any way exhibitor might think of. (i.e. made into furniture such as magazine rack or utilized for gardening purposes etc.). No glass.

19. Photo Scrapbooking

Youth can exhibit up to six (6) scrapbooking pages as one (1) exhibit.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

All exhibitors are cautioned to read carefully the following rules and regulations, as they will be enforced strictly, with no deviation.

ADMINISTRATION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Northwest Florida Fair Association and the UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service reserve the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regards there to, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incident to the Show, and right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. An exhibitor who violates any of the following rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Northwest Florida Fair or UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service may order.

STATEMENT OF LIABILITY

All livestock exhibits will be under the direction of the Northwest Florida Fair Association and the UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service, but the Northwest Florida Fair Association, University of Florida, UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service, its employees and volunteers, and the Okaloosa Board of County Commissioners, will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal or article exhibited by him/her and for its description as given in the catalog, and shall indemnify the Northwest Florida Fair Association, University of Florida, UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service, its employees and volunteers, and Okaloosa Board of County Commissioners, against all legal or other proceedings in regard there to, as well as damage or injury to any other person or property, caused by the exhibitor, or any of the animals exhibited by him/her, or arising out of, or in any way connected with such exhibition of any of the animals so exhibited.

The Fair Management and UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibit, animal, or fowl that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable.

Each exhibitor (and exhibitor's parent or legal guardian) must sign the statement acknowledging that he/she understands and will abide by the liability requirements and rules and regulations of the Northwest Florida Fair and UF/IFAS Okaloosa County Extension Service. If the exhibitor does not sign this statement his/her application for entry will not be accepted.

DRESS CODE

Exhibitors must be clean and neat and dressed in long pants or skirt with solid white dress shirt or blouse. The 4-H Emblem must be visible on the shirt. Closed toe shoes are required. Exhibitor Tags are required to identify youth without favoritism and will be provided to youth at registration and inspection. Showmanship is based on grooming and training of the animal, and the appearance and behavior of the exhibitor.

4-H BUILDING HOSTING

All Exhibitors who are exhibiting live animals are responsible for hosting the 4-H Building during the fair week. This included all poultry, rabbit, and any other animal placed on exhibit is the 4-H Building. It is encouraged that those who participate in shows and project exhibits also host the building. Each community club will also be responsible for hosting the building one night during fair. This includes caring for the animals on exhibit and cleaning as needed.

1. Entries are restricted to bona fide 4-H members who have reached his/her 5th birthday by Sept. 1st and has not passed his/her 19th birthday prior to Sept. 1st of the current 4-H year.
2. No diseased, infested, and/or externally parasitic entries will be allowed. All entries will be inspected.
3. Limited cage space: first register, first serve basis
4. No handling of rabbits besides day of judging/show
5. Entries must be owned and cared for at least 30 days prior to registration
6. Rabbits must be 8 weeks of age or older, no pregnant does
7. Rabbits must be well-groomed and prepared
8. Maximum of 3 entries per exhibitor
9. Best of breed and best of opposite: Premium and Rosette given to each breed entered with two or more of the same breed. When one Rabbit is entered, it is the judge's decision to reward Premium and Rosette or Participation Ribbon and \$10.00 Premium
10. Must have rabbit exhibit at the Northwest Florida Fair to enter in Showmanship
11. Judge may or may not ask questions of the exhibitor during Showmanship

1. Entries are restricted to bona fide 4-H members who have reached his/her 5th birthday by Sept. 1st and has not passed his/her 19th birthday prior to Sept. 1st of the current 4-H year.
2. No diseased, infested, and/or externally parasitic entries will be allowed. All entries will be inspected. All poultry will be tested for negative Pullorum-Typhoid before being accepted
3. Limited cage space: first register, first serve basis.
4. No handling of poultry besides day of judging/show
5. Entries must be owned and cared for at least 30 days prior to registration
6. Poultry must be well-groomed and prepared
7. Poultry must be 6 months of age or older. It is not recommended to exhibit poultry older than 3 years of age depending on body condition and condition of plumage.
8. It is not recommended to exhibit poultry in molt or with unfavorable marks
9. Recommended to remove feed/water at least 30min prior to judging
10. Exhibitor may show 1 pair (two poultry, regardless of sex) per class. Total of 10 Poultry entries will be permitted per exhibitor. A maximum of 2 Standard, 2 Bantam, 2 Exotic, 2 Game Birds, and 2 Waterfowl will be permitted per exhibitor. Showmanship poultry are exempt from this if it can share a cage with another poultry bird.
11. Must have Poultry exhibit at the Northwest Florida Fair to enter in Showmanship
12. Judge may or may not ask questions of the exhibitor during Showmanship

1. Entries are restricted to bona fide 4-H members who have reached his/her 5th birthday by Sept. 1st and has not passed his/her 19th birthday prior to Sept. 1st of the current 4-H year.
2. Veterinary proof of up-to date shots is required at check-in. All entries shall be clean and free of external parasites and free from any obvious signs of illness/injury. No female dogs in heat are permitted.
3. One dog per exhibitor. Dogs must be 6 months of age or older
4. Dogs must be well-groomed and prepared.
5. Exhibitors must stay with dogs in area provided for the Dog Show only, not permitted in the carnival area or other fair buildings. No dogs are to be left in cars/kennels/barn stall.
6. Animals must be leashed at all times and must be able to control their dog. Exhibitors are responsible for picking up after dog and themselves
7. Entries must be owned and cared for by exhibitor or member of the immediate family or leased. If leasing, documentation(mutual agreement signed and dated) must be shown at registration
8. No electric collars, pinch/prong collars, and chain leashes are permitted. Dogs should be shown on flat buckle or martingale collar, or appropriate show lead collar combo. No harness shall be allowed in Obedience or showmanship in the Junior, Intermediate, or Senior Classes. Cloverbuds may use head collars or front clip harnesses in classes other than showmanship.
9. Showmanship class presents knowledge of anatomy, ring etiquette, handling skills, grooming, and appropriate show equipment. Best Trick Class: youth must be able to handle and move all props in/out of ring on own. Best Costume: majority must be made by youth, judging dog's costume only.
